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



INVESTMENT IN SOCIAL ENTERPRISES: KEY TO REALISING SOCIAL JUSTICE

Social enterprises are the critical point for changing the dynamics of humanitarian response and inclusive development.

A bold statement regularly stated from workshops and podiums where people talk of localization, inclusion, and related matters for addressing inequality and resultant perpetuation of inequity.

The SARS-CoV-2, COVID-19, pandemic brought forward learnings which dominant actors in the humanitarian and health sectors have seemingly not picked up on. Moves now appearing regarding how public-private partnerships in morphing into public-private - philanthropic nexus means those large, often bureaucratic, organizations who did not deliver effectively (no matter their claims of efficiency and seeking to continue an oligopoly on relevance) are now being challenged in terms of all OECD-DAC evaluation criteria.

THE CONSIDERATIONS REVOLVE AROUND EXTERNAL FACTORS

1.Digital engagement; the use of artificial intelligence (AI) allied to continued improvements in how we use mobile telephony, means basics can be delivered through a blended learning approach linking digital engagement with local networks of primary health care. Infrastructure of this nature costs money and it is where socially minded enterprise is critical in linking in with corporates providing the base infrastructure.

The mobile telephony operators know the value in providing such engagement and so Mobiklinic's socially minded approach fits. We are moving from the commercial mindset of corporate social responsibility to shared value. The Japanese caring capitalism thinking of keiretsu; involvement of all in a supply chain from producers through to consumers.

2. With digital engagement comes citizen science. People are fed up with being merely statistics in proposals perpetuating the situation developed over the last three decades. **Mobiklinic's** 2023 engagement with **Simprints** has shown the potential for biometrics and how people can take control of their personal data.

Mobiklinic's facilitation of local engagement is the key to changing dynamics with the Government reinforcing its role in policy frameworks and quality assurance and people taking control of their data and information as a foundation for building knowledge with individuals, mothers, families and into communities.

3. Lessons from supply chains.

Drones are great and will capture headlines for small medical supply show pieces, but the real engagement will be control of supply chains. This builds from active engagement in the costing of supplies ensuring there are the right pieces to satisfy people's needs but also warranting there is not waste. Waste costs money and undermines credibility of health services. Enterprises are aware of their need to cost everything and ensure quality is apparent developing efficient and effective supply chains.

4. With the changes being wrought by Al take-up, the value in long chains where different actors are becoming rentseekers rather than performing to add value. We are now developing value constellations with the guiding principles of localization affirming accountability frameworks. Accountability in addressing health needs now and into the future. Developing the infrastructure to support public health centers in locations fitting to people's needs. Developing skills and opportunities for young people to have a career path as a health worker in their community as they are supported by MobiKlinic's digital skills development built on Clarke University professionalism. Delivering in standards set by the public sector and supported by resources to reinforce accountability within this local governance and socio-economic setting. This is where the move to Public - Private -Philanthropic Partnership comes to the fore.

Bridging the Gap with the Community Health Worker (CHP) App

At Mobiklinic, we recognize the vital role of Community Health Workers (CHWs) in delivering healthcare services to underserved communities. To empower these frontline heroes, we developed a robust CHP app. This app not only facilitates doctor consultations through chat but also includes an emergency response feature allowing CHWs to swiftly call for an ambulance in critical situations.

The integration of biometrics within the app serves a dual purpose: reducing data duplications and ensuring easy patient identification. This, in turn, streamlines the management of patient records, allowing for more efficient and accurate healthcare delivery. Moreover, our in-house AI medical assistant, Moby, provides essential healthcare guidelines during times when direct doctor consultations are unavailable, enabling CHWs to carry out their work effectively.

As the Chief Technology Officer at Mobiklinic, I am excited to share the incredible wins we have made in transforming healthcare access in rural Africa through cutting-edge technology. Our commitment to innovation and positive impact is at the core of everything we do, and I'm thrilled to highlight some of our key initiatives.

Strengthening Data Protection for Community Beneficiaries

We understand the sensitivity of healthcare data and prioritize the protection of our community beneficiaries. Employing state-of-the-art encryption technologies, we ensure that patient data is secured and accessible only to authorized personnel. 
Pioneering Telemedicine for Patient Convenience

WE ARE PIONEERS IN BIOMETRIC FACIAL PATIENT IDENTIFICATION

Integrating Simprints Facial Biometrics technology into our Digital Community Health Tool.

The health information technology space has over time proved to be highly dynamic, routinely generating new innovations with an end goal of achieving a seamless flow of health services especially in last-mile areas to support frontline health workers.

This year, we partnered with Simprints, one of the premier innovative identification technology companies to equip our Community health workers(CHWs) with mobile facial biometrics technology to quicken and ease identification and verification of beneficiaries for vaccines and other community-based health services.

With support from the Pfizer Foundation, King Baudouin Foundation, and Duke Global Health Innovation Center, Mobiklinic has been able to achieve successful integration of Simprits facial biometrics technology into our digital community health tool and unlocked another level of efficiency in community health service delivery.

We have piloted facial biometrics technology among 10 CHWs in Kiyindi Landing Site, Buikwe District, Central Uganda. Good news: The CHWs found the technology easy to learn, convenient to use, and more importantly, time-saving during service delivery. The technology creates efficiency given that it significantly reduces the time it takes to identify and verify a beneficiary. The efficiency has been evidenced by the higher average number of beneficiaries tended to by this group of CHWs compared to those without biometrics.









In addition to the operational efficiency, the Simprints facial biometrics technology has eliminated duplication of data and improved the authenticity of data collected by CHWs given that each entry has to be biometrically verified. Overall, there is an effortless layer of security and quality assurance embedded into our data flow chain ensuring data reliability for understanding public health trends and forecasting needs.

There is much that we have achieved through our partnership with Simprints but the cordial working relationship crafted and maintained stands out. This, and common interests have been the foundation of this success and will guarantee future shared workspaces, and resultant scaled efficiency in digitised community health systems.





Measuring digital readiness and technology acceptance in rural areas: A collaboration with F-vital Inc.

Digitised frontline Community health workers will precipitate Universal Health Coverage by 2030 but digitization should be community-based to achieve impactful outcomes.

Community-based development can ensure inclusivity, guarantee technology acceptance, lead to efficient resource mobilization and utilization, and ultimately create the desired impact in community health systems. Digital readiness assessment should proceed development of a digital health tool. This informs software, hardware, training, and partnership needs which are critical for developing easy and relevant technologies for a particular population and need. Technology acceptance assessment helps determine the biggest drivers of technology acceptance and usage among user and beneficiary populations.

We were able to undertake digital readiness and technology acceptance assessment, thanks to Fvital Inc., the Japanese International Cooperation Agency, and Crossfields Japan. We discovered that all CHWs were eager to use digital health tools, but almost half of them needed financial (to purchase smartphones) and technical support to digitize fully. We also discovered gaps in the internet infrastructures that are currently hindering a smooth digital community health space.

he findings obtained have guided us in the targeted digitization of different communities in 2023 through addressing specific and diverse training, and financing needs. Nonetheless, digitized CHWs showed a much higher level of efficiency in community health service delivery and we are quite confident that with the complete digitization of community health systems, UHC2030 is in sight.

We are pleased to announce that Mobiklinic will be a member of the WHO Civil Society Health Commission, and the United Coverage(UHC) Taskforce for 2024. This commission brings together various stakeholders representing different constituencies from WHO committees, civil health society groups, international professional bodies, parliamentarians, and other healthcare bureaucrats.

The commission aims to foster improved engagement between WHO and Civil Society to achieve Universal Health Coverage by 2030.

Being providers of digital health solutions to frontline community health workers, we shall represent the constituencies of private digital health developers and implementers. We are very excited about our mandate with the WHO Civil Society Commission.

Regulatory frameworks for digital health

The information technology age is highly dynamic and this has presented regulatory challenges to authorities, investors, and developers in the health technology space. In some lax jurisdictions, loopholes that can be abused may be detrimental to personal and health data. In overzealous jurisdictions, an endless loop of regulations has made the development, piloting, and scaling of digital health solutions almost impossible or very expensive.



Fast forward to 2023, Mobiklinic participated in various forums locally and internationally, to share views on digital health regulation and data protection and ensure responsible but progressive advancement of the digital health space.

First Africa Health Tech Summit, Kigali, and the Rwanda-Uaanda Business Forum.

We attended the first Africa Health Tech Summit in Kigali Rwanda. In the plenary and breakaway sessions, we emphasized the need for robust and streamlined digital health policies to avoid multiplicity of regulatory responsibilities and authorities, reduce or eliminate cherry-picking of favourables among conflicting policies, and ease cost-effective compliance. We also discussed the cross-border regulatory opportunities presented by the African Continental Free Trade Area(AfCFTA) and the pathway to ratification by different countries.

Stakeholder Dialogue on Digital Health in Uganda.

Afya na Haki convened dignitaries from the Ministry of Health, technology developers, health practitioner licensing bodies, civil society, and academia to discuss the digital health landscape in Uganda. We deliberated on the current regulatory deficiencies in Uganda and the multiplicities presented by professional licensing policies, practicing regulatory policies, the Personal Data Protection Act, and the National Information Technology Agency Act. We reflected on the progress made so far in the regulatory space, shared learnings, and the way forward in digital health regulation. Seminar on Digital Health Data Management Among the Youth in Uganda

On 30th March 2023, we were invited by Afya na Haki to share and guide about digital health data management among the Youth in Uganda. This was a very strategic engagement considering that youths make up 60% of our community health workforce, and are poised to play a more prominent role both as providers and recipients of digital health services. We shared about responsible interaction with digital health service providers, the current data protection laws and how to seek redress in case of personal data breaches.





THE RIGHT PATH TO PATIENT IDENTIFICATION

SIMPRINTS - PARTNERSHIP MANAGER

In December 2023, Simprints conducted a field visit in Uganda to observe enrollment and identification of clients using biometrics technology. There are high levels of user adoption but also high demand related to community needs. To scale up the project, it is recommended that more community health workers be trained to provide timely and needed community health services for the population. Community members display a high level of acceptance of the technology. However, additional community engagements and communication materials are needed to explain the technology's benefits in delivering health services. Further, it is advised to engage the Ugandan Ministry of Health to discuss the potential use of Simprints and Mobiklinic technology at the health clinic level, which would establish reliable digital client records."
